47 Community Outreach Events involving over 21 Community Partners


We thank our partners, our neighbors, and the Town of East Hampton, for helping us to inspire creativity, and for being a part of the vibrant cultural fabric we are weaving.

EXHIBITIONS 2023

AIRING OF THE QUILTS: April 20

This community event celebrates an age old tradition and rite of spring. All our neighbors are invited to venture outside, hang their quilts, and tell their stories!



LOUIS BRAWLEY: July 9 - October 8

Brawley's rough-hewn waggish sculptures arise from fallen timber the artist collected during his pandemic stay in New Jersey, where he adapted his practice to the nature of his environment.



EXHIBITIONS 2023: April 29 - June 4

DON CHRISTENSEN: Wood Paintings in a Wood Barn Christensen presented a series of salvaged wood paintings, constructed from individually painted panels mosaicked together in rectilinear patterns.



BRIANNA HERNÁNDEZ: Aquí Descansamos


This installation built on Hernández's ongoing work expressing the complex layers of end-of-life care, the dying process, grief, and mourning rituals.



EXHIBITIONS: June 10 - July 9, 2023

MISLA: En Casa

Misla is a native New Yorker and mixed-media artist. In En Casa, she presented an ongoing series of paintings alongside an installation of furniture and other domestic trappings, celebrating the imagery of distinctly Nuyorican apartments.



SARA MEJIA KRIENDLER: Field Notes

The heart of Kriendler's exhibition was an installation composed of bundles of sage and cedar bound in gold wire, forming a tapestry of Pre-colombian inspired traditions and our local environment.



EXHIBITIONS: July 26 - August 20, 2023

TARA GEER: Sown in the Half Light

Tara Geer measured, cut, tailored and re-sketched each work for this site-specific exhibit with respect to the historic structure of our barn walls. Her work matched the rawness of the space: the tangled lines and lumpy things seem to grow, not entirely rationally, in the half light.



WILLIAM ERIC BROWN: Atka

William Eric Brown's series is based on images his father shot on board the U.S. Navy icebreaker, U.S.S. Atka in the 1960's. Brown reconstitutes these images to create a new narrative, emphasizing the isolation and remoteness of the landscape.



EXHIBITIONS: August 26 - October 8, 2023

SUE MCNALLY: Mining the Middle

After decades of traveling the US, McNally has built a relationship with the American landscape, but loosens her ties to plein-air traditions to explore the space between abstraction and figuration.



TED TYLER: Ceramics

Tyler incorporates varied materials such as copper, wax and stone in his ceramic vignettes, and their forms are influenced by artists like Giorgio Morandi and Philip Guston.






ADAM O'FARRILL'S STRANGER THINGS: July 1

KAORU WATANABE: August 19

Former member of KODO, with collaborators including Yo-Yo Ma, Wes Anderson, Jason Moran, and Mikhail Baryshnikov, Kaoru Watanabe performs new works for Japanese flutes and percussion, Japanese taiko drum, and shinobue flutes.



MAMBO LOCO: September 10




