





The John Little Studio at Historic Duck Creek Farm is located at 367 Three

After an 18-month restoration, the historic barn that once housed the studio

of the artist John Little will open to the public on Saturday, July 15 with an

Mile Harbor Hog Creek Road, on the former Duck Creek Farm, an 18th century homestead. The property is owned by the Town of East Hampton. Its restoration and adaptation as a community arts center was spearheaded by a group of local residents, who will manage it under the auspices of Peconic Historic Preservation, a 501(c) (3) not-for-profit corporation.

In keeping with its history as an artist's studio from the 1950s through 1984

and the site of many artists' gatherings, the barn and surrounding grounds

will be available for art exhibitions and related community programming.


